Hello Dancers,

We are looking forward to seeing you for our creative dance workshop with Dublin, Ireland based - CoisCéim Dance Theatre and special screening of their performance of "The Wolf and Peter" on Sunday, December 6^{th.}

A few notes about how to best participate in our program are below:

- 1. A link to the Zoom meeting for this workshop will be sent to the email you registered with no later than one hour before the workshop begins. The workshop will start promptly so please ensure you are logged in and ready to dance 5-10 minutes before the scheduled start time. To be ready to join in on time, please ensure you download and install Zoom in advance. You can do so here.
- 2. Requirements for Participation- A parent or adult in the family must be present in the room throughout the session, and if necessary be available to assist their child.
 - Computer/Tablet/Phone with internet access for Zoom placed on a table at children's eye level
 - A clear floor area of about 8 paces square free of movable furniture and all other hard objects (or as close as possible).
 - o The best floor surfaces are carpet, linoleum or wood
 - o Dancing on kitchen tiles or concrete is **TO BE AVOIDED**

Children should wear the following:

- sweats, leggings / t-shirt (or other clothes that are easy to move around in)
- Bare feet or sneakers as preferred
- No jewelry is recommended

Costume Recommendations (Optional but fun):

In the workshop children will explore 3 main characters - Peter, the Wolf and the Duck. We suggest brining the following items (or something similar) to wear when we change into these different characters during the workshop.

- A stripy shirt for **Peter**
- A yellow accessory such as a scarf/gloves/handkerchief for the **Duck**
- A furry/woolly hat (or another item) for the Wolf.

Online platform: The workshop will be delivered using <u>Zoom video call software</u> and no recordings will be made in line with CoisCéim's Child Protection Policy. This will be a private Zoom session which will only be accessed by those booked into the workshop, the dance artist and one member of Irish Arts Center staff.
